Why the RNLI needs this role:	This role will help us save lives at sea by assisting with the safe launch and recovery of the lifeboat on service and exercise.
Potential time commitment:	Will vary depending on the operational need of the lifeboat station. Willingness to volunteer at weekends and anti-social hours.

This role involves:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Complying with the RNLI Volunteer Commitment Assisting with the launch and recovery of the lifeboat(s) on service and exercise Undertaking training, becoming competent and then maintaining competence under Competency Based Training (CoBT) as necessary to fulfil the role of shore crew In conjunction with the crew and other volunteers, contributing to the overall standard of the station, lifeboats and equipment including making ready for service, once a service or exercise is completed Maintaining good relationships, the trust and confidence of other volunteers and staff involved with the station and its management Contributing to the overall reputation of the Institution by being a good ambassador for the lifeboat station, afloat, ashore and in the community Being familiar with the Green Book of Regulations, Synergy Based Working Practices and other volunteer policies and documents appropriate to your role Becoming involved in other activities as required
