Tractor Driver – All-weather Lifeboat (ALB) & Inshore Lifeboat (ILB)

Why the RNLI needs this role:	This role will help us save lives at sea by maintaining and cleaning the tractor as well driving the tractor to launch and recover the lifeboat.
Potential time commitment:	Will vary depending on the operational need of the lifeboat station. Willingness to volunteer at weekends and anti-social hours

Role specific requirements:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Stepping down age 65 May be subject to DBS/PVG/Garda checks during the recruitment process
This role involves:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Complying with the RNLI Volunteer Commitment Taking charge of the launch vehicle and rig during the launch and recovery of the ALB or ILB for services and exercises under the direction of the Head launcher, coxswain or helmsman so far as availability allows Maintaining competence under Competency Based Training (CoBT) to fulfil the role and contribute to the training of the crew and shore crew Assisting the station mechanic, maintainers and/or coast staff with maintenance and repairs as appropriate Contributing to the operational efficiency of the station, lifeboats and equipment including making ready for service once a service or exercise is completed. Being familiar with the Green Book of Regulations, Synergy Based Working Practices and other volunteer policies and documents appropriate to your role. Becoming involved in other activities as required.
